## **Community Statement Denouncing Anti-Immigrant Hate**

Local leaders release joint statement calling for dignity and safety

**Evansville, IN** – On behalf of the signatories listed below, United Way of Southwestern Indiana today released the following statement denouncing anti-immigrant hate:

In recent weeks, a surge of harmful rhetoric against the Haitian immigrant community has swept across national media. Here in Evansville, this hostility has escalated to alarming levels, with online threats targeting charitable organizations that support our immigrant communities. Even more troubling, leaders of our local Haitian community have been subjected to violence.

Evansville's motto is "*E is for Everyone*." We are committed to upholding this value, not just in words but in action. Many of us have immigrant roots within a few generations, and our community is profoundly enriched by the presence of our immigrant neighbors. Their art, food, culture, talents, and diverse perspectives add vibrancy and depth to our shared life.

We stand united in condemning all threats and acts of violence against our immigrant friends and neighbors. We are resolute in fostering a community where every individual's dignity is upheld. Protecting the dignity and safety of our immigrant residents is not just a moral imperative; it is a shared responsibility that belongs to every person in Evansville.

We invite you to take a stand and join us in denouncing hate and violence in any form. Together, we can ensure that Evansville remains a place where "everyone" truly means everyone.
