Ben, who was once unhoused, got connected with the free transportation service, which allowed him to get a job, keep it, and save for an apartment.



After being removed from foster care, Jenna rebuilt stability through therapy, reuniting with her foster family, earning her high school equivalency, and securing a job.



A once-withdrawn student with intermittent schooling built literacy skills, friendships, and confidence through an afterschool program, leading to stronger language development and a more positive attitude toward school.



After being denied homeownership due to disqualifying debt, a single mother enrolled in the Almost Home Program and is now on track to pay off her debt early and qualify for her own home.



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
